Tenothrips longirostrum

Distinguishing features

This species has not been studied by the present authors. According to Nakahara (1995: 236) it is distinguished from the other five species he placed in *Ewartithrips* by the long mouth cone that extends onto the mesosternum.

Related species

Although transferred to the genus *Ewartithrips* by Nakahara (1996), separation of that Californian genus from the Mediterranean genus *Tenothrips* is doubtful (Bhatti, 2003).

Biological data

Presumably flower-living, and possibly in Lupinus spp. [Fabaceae].

Distribution data

Known only from California.
