Distribution and Habitat

Yallingup to William Bay, growing in deep sandy soils in coastal woodlands and shrublands. The <u>species</u> is most abundant in disturbed areas along the edges of graded tracks and firebreaks.

Flowering Months

Description

A late flowering <u>species</u> 200–250 mm high with a hairy leaf 80–100 mm long by 2–5 mm wide and up to three pale creamy-yellow, sometimes green-tinged flowers 50–70 mm across. The leaf is often shrivelled at the time of flowering.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from other members of the Caladenia filamentosa <u>complex</u> by its shortened <u>petals</u> and <u>sepals</u>, late flowering period and coastal distribution.
