Distribution and Habitat

Albany to Harvey, growing in sandy soils in forests, woodlands and shrublands. Plants often flower in greater profusion in the season following summer fire.

Description

A common <u>species</u> 200–350 mm (rarely to 40 mm) high with a hairy leaf 70–200 mm long by 20–25 mm wide and up to three green, yellow and red flowers 30–40 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

The <u>species</u> is sometimes confused with the related <u>Clubbed</u> Spider Orchid (Caladenia longiclavata) but has smaller flowers and a smaller <u>labellum</u> with shorter, more widely spaced <u>fringe segments</u>.
