Distribution and Habitat

Tone River to Tunney, growing in lateritic soils in forests and woodlands.

Flowering Months

..... Sep Oct ..

Description

An uncommon species 100–250 mm high with a hairy leaf 70–90 mm long by 2–3 mm wide and up to two blood-red flowers 50–60 mm across.



Caladenia erythrochila

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Slender Spider Orchid (*Caladenia pulchra*) and Blood Spider Orchid (*C. filifera*) by its much smaller flowers, usually more stiffly held petals and sepals and south-westerly distribution.
