Description

A geographically restricted <u>species</u> 200–450 mm high with a hairy leaf 50–200 mm long by 4–6 mm wide and up to two green, yellow and red flowers 30–50 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Smooth-lipped Spider Orchid (Caladenia integra) by its smaller flowers, smaller <u>labellum</u> with <u>calli</u> extending well onto the dark purple apex and easterly distribution.
