A common wheatbelt species 200–400 mm high with a hairy leaf 100–200 mm long by 5–15 mm wide and up to three green, yellow and red flowers 50-90 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Caladenia attingens by its larger flowers and more northerly distribution.
