Distribution and Habitat

Shark Bay to Coorow, growing in sandy and sandy-clay soils in woodlands and shrublands.

Description

A northern **subspecies** 80–150 mm high with a hairy leaf, 50–120 mm long by 10–12 mm wide, which is tinged reddish-purple on the underside and up to three (rarely four) lemon-yellow, fawnish-brown or red blotched flowers 20–30 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the other **subspecies** by its prominently blotched flowers, more numerous **labellum fringe segments** and more northerly distribution.
