Description

A near-coastal <u>species</u> 250–500 mm high with a hairy leaf 120–220 mm long by 5–12 mm wide and up to three white, pale yellow to pale yellowish-green and red flowers 50–80 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Carousel Spider Orchid (Caladenia arenicola) by its paler flower colour, shorter <u>petals</u> which lack clubs and finer <u>labellum fringe segments</u> with acute tips.
