Description

A rare coastal <u>species</u> 200–350 mm high with a hairy leaf 100–180 mm long by 6–10 mm wide and up to two yellowish-cream, white and red flowers 30–50 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Funnel-tipped Spider Orchid (Caladenia infundibularis) by its yellowish-cream, white and red, rather than green, yellow and red flowers and more easterly distribution.
