Description

An attractive species 200–400 mm high with a hairy leaf 150–250 mm long by 6–8 mm wide and up to three pale pink to deep pink flowers 50-70 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Majestic Spider Orchid (Caladenia winfieldii) by its smaller, paler pink flowers and bicoloured white and pink <u>labellum</u>.
