Description

A late flowering species 200-400 mm high with a hairy leaf 100-200 mm long by 5-10 mm wide and up to two creamy-white to creamy-yellow, red-marked flowers 50-100 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the co-occurring Christmas Spider Orchid (Caladenia serotina) by its shorter, spreading petals, clubbed sepals and generally earlier flowering period.
