Description

A rare <u>species</u> 200–400 mm (rarely to 600 mm) high with a hairy leaf 100–250 mm long by 15–25 mm wide and up to three pale yellow-green and red flowers 50–60 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related <u>Clubbed</u> Spider Orchid (Caladenia longiclavata) by the extremely long clubs on the <u>sepals</u> which extend at least half their length versus around a third their length on C. longiclavata.
