Description

A small flowered subspecies 50-100 mm high with a hairy leaf 50-90 mm long by 5-10 mm wide and up to three pale to deep-pink or, more rarely, white flowers 10-20 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the subsp. unita by its shorter stature, smaller flowers and generally earlier flowering period.
