Distribution and Habitat

Nerren Nerren Station to Israelite Bay, growing in sandy, sandy-clay and granitic soils in woodlands and shrublands. The *species* is particularly common on inland granite outcrops and rocky hills.

Description

An inland *species* 80–100 mm high with a hairy leaf 50–120 mm long by 4–5 mm wide and up to two greenish-yellow and red flowers 10–15 mm across.



Caladenia pachychila

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Zebra orchid (*Caladenia cairnsiana*) by its shorter scapes, smaller lighter-coloured flowers, slightly spreading, rather than hanging *petals* and *lateral sepals* and narrower, less rounded *labellum* which is held horizontally and has a larger *apical* callus.
