#### Distribution and Habitat

Northampton to Augusta and eastwards to Esperance, growing in sandy, sandy-clay and lateritic soils in forests, woodlands and shrublands. In some areas the <u>subspecies</u> flowers only in the season following summer fire while in others it flowers every year.

### Description

A clump-forming <u>subspecies</u> 50–120 mm high with a hairy leaf, 40–90 mm long by 8–10 mm wide, which is tinged reddish-purple on the underside and up to three pale to deep pink flowers 15–25 mm across.

## Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the similar Pink Fairies (Caladenia latifolia) by its usually smaller leaf, fewer flowered <u>inflorescence</u>, smaller flowers, dark pink <u>labellum</u> apex and generally more inland distribution. It also often grows in dense clumps unlike the more widely-spaced colonies of C. latifolia.
