Description

A geographically restricted <u>species</u> 160–210 mm high with a hairy leaf 60–150 mm long by 2–4 mm wide and up to three creamy-white, pale yellow or pale red flowers 50–70 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Dwarf Common Spider Orchid (Caladenia hiemalis) which has a similar early flowering period by its variably coloured flowers, longer, <u>petals</u> and <u>lateral</u> <u>sepals</u> and more inland range of distribution.
