Distribution and Habitat

Clackline to Cranbrook with disjunct populations near Kalbarri, growing in sandy and sandy-clay soils in woodlands and shrublands.

Flowering Months

Description

An uncommon **hybrid** 100–250 mm high with a dull green, prominently hairy leaf 50–100 mm long by 10–15 mm wide and up to three creamy-white to pale yellow flowers 50–70 mm across.

Notes

A hybrid between Cowslip Orchid (*Caladenia flava*) and White Spider Orchid (*C. longicauda*). A similar hybrid but with pink flowers has been recorded between Pink Fairies (*Caladenia latifolia*) and *C. longicauda*.
