Description

An uncommon hybrid 100-250 mm high with a dull green, prominently hairy leaf 50-100 mm long by 10-15 mm wide and up to three creamy-white to pale yellow flowers 50-70 mm across.

Notes

A hybrid between Cowslip Orchid (Caladenia flava) and White Spider Orchid (C. longicauda). A similar hybrid but with pink flowers has been recorded between Pink Fairies (Caladenia latifolia) and C. longicauda.
