Jurien Bay to Bremer Bay with a disjunct population at Mt Arid, growing in sandy, sandy-clay and lateritic soils in forests and woodlands, flowering best in the season following summer fire.

Description

A common high rainfall <u>species</u> 150–400 mm high with a broad, silky-hairy leaf, 50–120 mm long by 10–20 mm wide, which is green or slightly tinged reddish-purple on the underside and up to three (rarely four) mauve-blue or, more rarely, white flowers 30–40 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the other members of the Cyanicula sericea <u>complex</u> by its larger, broader leaf, taller stature, larger flowers and south-westerly distribution.
