# Description

A wheatbelt <u>species</u> 150–300 mm high with two to three smooth leaves 120–250 mm long by 8–12 mm wide and up to four pale yellow to yellow, brown marked flowers 18–28 mm across.

## **Distinguishing Features**

It is distinguished from the related Common Donkey Orchid (Diuris corymbosa) by its shorter stature, fewer flowered <u>inflorescence</u> and smaller flowers.
