Description

A late flowering species 300-450 mm high with four to five smooth leaves 100-180 mm long by 2-4 mm wide and up to eight pale yellow, brown marked flowers 20-25 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is closely related to Tall Donkey Orchid (Diuris drummondii), predominantly differing in its shorter stature and smaller flowers.
