Description

A rare species 200–400 mm high with two to six smooth leaves 60-150 mm long by 1-2 mm wide and up to five yellow and reddish-brown marked flowers 15-20 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Bee Orchid (Diuris laxiflora) by its more darkly marked flowers and, although the flowering of the two <u>species</u> overlaps, generally later flowering period.
