An uncommon <u>species</u> 300–600 mm high with two to four smooth leaves 80–150 mm long by 1–2 mm wide and up to six small pale yellow, brown marked flowers 7–10 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It often grows with Bee Orchid (Diuris laxiflora) but has smaller, paler coloured flowers with more rounded <u>petals</u> and a shorter, more flattened <u>labellum midlobe</u>.
