Distribution and Habitat

Tardun to Merredin, growing in sandy-clay soils in woodlands and shrublands. The <u>species</u> is also often found in shallow soil pockets on granite outcrops.

## Description

A recently recognised <u>species</u> 150–350 mm high with two to three smooth leaves 100–200 mm long by 4–7 mm wide and up to seven pale yellow and light brown flowers 12–16 mm across.

## Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Mini Donkey Orchid (Diuris recurva) by its larger, generally paler coloured flowers.
