Augusta to Condingup, growing in sandy-clay and clay soils in seasonally wet areas, flowering best in the season following summer fire.

Description

A late flowering species 200–350 mm high with two to four smooth leaves 80–150 mm long by 1.5-2.5 mm wide and up to five small, yellow, brown marked flowers 15-20 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Late Donkey Orchid (Diuris emarginata) by its shorter stature, fewer flowered <u>inflorescence</u> and smaller flowers.
