Description

An early flowering $\underline{\text{species}}$ 150–350 mm high with two to three smooth leaves 50–200 mm long by 3–7 mm wide and up to four yellow and brown flowers 20-30 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It has been confused with Winter Donkey Orchid (Diuris brumalis) but has fewer, generally more darkly marked flowers and a larger labellum midlobe. It also has a generally earlier flowering period and a more
