Description

An inland bee <u>species</u> 200–600 mm high with four to six smooth leaves 100–150 mm long by 2–4 mm wide and up to eight yellow or creamy-white, brown marked flowers 20–30 mm across. Populations of creamy-white flowered plants can occasionally be found.

Distinguishing Features

The <u>species</u> is related to Bee Orchid (Diuris laxiflora) and Common Bee Orchid (D. decrementum) but has larger flowers and a more inland range of distribution.
