### Distribution and Habitat

Bindoon to Mt Barker, growing in sandy-clay and clay soils in forests, woodlands and shrublands.

### Flowering Months

### Description

A small-flowered *species* 150–350 mm high with two to three smooth leaves 100–200 mm long by 10–15 mm wide and up to seven yellow and brown flowers 15–25 mm across.

### Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Common Orchid (*Diuris corymbosa*) by its darker coloured flower stem and smaller, more darkly marked flowers.
