## Description

A coastal species 100-300 mm high with two to three smooth leaves 80-150 mm long by 4-6 mm wide and up to five colourful golden-yellow and reddish-brown flowers 15-25 mm across.

## Distinguishing Features

It is related to Beautiful Donkey Orchid (Diuris pulchella) but has reddish-brown rather than mauve marked flowers, a more prominent labellum midlobe and a much more easterly distribution. It is also possibly related to Green Range Donkey Orchid (D. littoralis) with which it sometimes grows but has smaller flowers and a shorter, broader <u>labellum midlobe</u>.
