Description

A near coastal <u>species</u> 200-600 mm high with two to three smooth leaves 100-300 mm long by 4-12 mm wide and up to five pale yellow, suffused light brown flowers 30-40 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Dunsborough Donkey Orchid (Diuris jonesii) by its smaller, pale yellow and light brown flowers.
