Distribution and Habitat

Collie to Stirling Range, growing in sandy soils in forests and woodlands.

Flowering Months

Sep Oct Nov

Description


A late flowering [species](#) 150–300 mm high with a minutely hairy, heart-shaped, ground-hugging leaf 12–20 mm long by 10–18 mm wide and a single dull greenish-yellow and purplish-red flower 3–5 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Lonely Hammer Orchid (*Drakaea isolata*) by its later flowering period, larger flowers and more south-westerly distribution.
