Description

An attractive $\underline{\text{species}}$ 300–1000 mm high with a smooth tubular leaf 400–800 mm long by 5–10 mm wide and up to 70 brownish-green, pink and white flowers 9–10 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the distantly related Frilled Leek Orchid (Prasophyllum sargentii) by its taller flower scapes, larger <u>labellum</u> and south-westerly distribution.
