### Distribution and Habitat

York to Esperance, growing in sandy soils in woodlands and shrublands.

### Description

A large flowered species 90–170 mm high with four to six leaves forming a ground-hugging or ascending basal rosette 20–55 mm across, two to three cauline leaves and one (rarely two) translucent, fawn and white flowers 7–12 mm across.

### Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the sometimes co-occurring Hairy Stemmed Snail Orchid (*Pterostylis setulosa*) by its larger fawn and white flowers and thickened lateral sepals.
