Armadale to Mundaring, growing in lateritic soils in forests.





Description

A geographically restricted [species](#) 200–400 mm high with eight to 18 [cauline](#) leaves 35–60 mm long by 5–8 mm wide and up to 15 semi translucent, dark reddish-brown and white flowers 12–16 mm across.



Pterostylis crebriflora

Distinguishing Features

It is similar in colour and form to Crowded Banded Greenhood (*Pterostylis atrosanguinea*), appearing to differ only in its flowers being crowded at the top of the [scape](#).
