Distribution and Habitat

Northampton to Toolina Cove, growing in sandy, sandy-clay, lateritic and granitic soils in forests, woodlands, shrublands and shallow soil pockets on granite outcrops.

Description

An early flowering *species* 50–150 mm high with three to five *cauline* leaves 5–20 mm long by 1–4 mm wide and one (rarely two) translucent, green and pale white flowers 7–10 mm across. Vegetative plants have a *basal rosette* of leaves and flowering plants have just *cauline* leaves.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from members of the *Pterostylis aspera* *complex* by its smaller flowers and thickened *lateral sepals*. Unlike members of the *Pterostylis nana* *complex* it lacks a *basal rosette* of leaves when flowering.
