Distribution and Habitat

Gingin to Albany, growing in sandy-clay soils in seasonally wet flats.

Flowering Months

Description

A tall [species](#) 100–400 mm high with four or five [basal](#) leaves forming an ascending [basal rosette](#) 20–30 mm across, six to 10 [cauline](#) leaves and one (rarely two) translucent, green and white flowers 6–8 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the other members of the *Pterostylis nana* [complex](#) by its loose [basal rosette](#) of leaves and tall flower [scape](#) up to 400 mm high.
