Description

A rare rock inhabiting species 50-150 mm high with a narrow, smooth leaf 60-120 mm long by 5-12 mm wide and up to four blue, white or purple self-pollinating flowers 18-25 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the closely related Coastal Sun Orchid (Thelymitra granitora) by its smaller, less numerous flowers and more northerly, inland distribution.
