Description

An attractive <u>species</u> 100–200 mm high with a narrow, smooth leaf 30–70 mm long by 4–8 mm wide at its widest point and up to two purple and golden-yellow flowers 30–50 mm across.

Distinguishing Features

It is distinguished from the related Southern Queen of Sheba (Thelymitra porphyrosticta) by its fewer flowered <u>inflorescence</u>, more northerly and easterly distribution and preference for sandy-clay rather than sandy soils.
